COUNT 1 – POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, TO WIT COCAINE, FOR SALE OR DISTRIBUTION

COUNT 2- POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, TO WIT MDMA, FOR SALE OR DISTRIBUTION

On or about January 25, 2008, DAVID JONES did knowingly possess a controlled substance, to wit MDMA, with the specific intent to sell or distribute such substance in violation of Health and Safety Code section 11378.

SYNOPSIS:

On 01/25/08 at 1600 hours, Officer J. Kilter conducted a stop on a vehicle. The driver, David Jones, was found to have waived his fourth amendment rights. A search of Jones and the vehicle revealed 50 ecstasy pills on Jones, and approximately a half a pound of cocaine in the trunk.

INVESTIGATION:

On 01/25/08, Detectives J. Nance, M. Romo, and I were called to Headquarters to assist Officers J. Kilter #56, and A. Thomas #68 on an arrest of two individuals for a large amount of cocaine, and ecstasy pills. Officer Kilter had stopped a vehicle (Ca 3PJX384) on Hwy 54 eastbound at Reo Drive, driven by a male later identified as David Jones. The vehicle was registered to Jane Smith. There was also a male passenger in the vehicle later identified as Ramon Ramirez. A records check revealed Jones had waived his fourth amendment rights. Officer Kilter searched Jones and found 5 ecstasy pills in a plastic baggie inside Jones' left front jeans pocket. Officer Kilter also searched the vehicle and found a bag in the trunk containing a large amount of cocaine.

We assisted with processing, impounding evidence, and interviews of Jones and Ramirez. Jones admitted the ecstasy pills, and cocaine belonged to him, so Ramirez was released on a detention only.

SUSPECTS STATEMENT:

At headquarters, I asked Jones who the ecstasy and cocaine belonged to. He answered, "It's all mine." Jones told me he had the cocaine and ecstasy because, "it's my buddies birthday today," and he said he is a DJ, and planned to party with several other people tonight. He told me he and 10 friends had chipped in to pay \$5000 for a half a pound of cocaine, for the birthday party tonight. I asked Jones where he got the cocaine from, and he told me he got it a "couple of days ago in Santa Barbara." He said he "picked it up at Jack In The Box right in the middle of town." I then asked Jones about the ecstasy, and he told me, "I think I've told you enough."

TRAINING and EXPERIENCE:

I am a peace officer employed by the Sunny Dale Police Department (hereafter designated SDPD) and have been so employed for over 13 years. I am currently assigned to the Narcotics Section and have been so assigned for approximately 1 ½ years. I was previously assigned for two years to Mid City Narcotic team #10. During this time, I have investigated illicit controlled substance trafficking in Sunny Dale and surrounding areas. I have had formal training and experience in controlled substance investigations, and I am familiar with the manner in which controlled substances, including cocaine, are packaged, marketed and consumed. I have received training in the identification of all types of controlled substances by sight and odor.

In the course of my employment, I have made or been involved in excess of 500 arrests for violations involving such substance, and I have become familiar with the ordinary meaning of controlled substance slang and jargon, and I am familiar with the manners and techniques of traffickers in cocaine as practiced locally.

I have purchased controlled substances over 100 times while in an undercover capacity, including cocaine, methamphetamine, heroin, and marijuana. I attended the POST 80 hour narcotic investigators school.

Based on my training and experience, I am familiar with dosage units for both cocaine and MDMA (ecstasy). A dosage unit is the average size quantity of any given controlled substance that will produce an effect. ½ pound of cocaine is in excess of 11,000 dosage units and had a street sale value of \$10,000.00. In my opinion based on the amount of cocaine possessed by Jones, it was clearly possessed for sale. Further, the possession of 5 tablets of MDMA (ecstasy) has a street sale value of \$100.00, thus, I believe it was possessed for sale.

LAB RESULTS:

The narcotics were impounded on tag number 04000. They were tested by laboratory personnel who found item number 3 contained 453 grams of cocaine and item number 5 contained 5 grams of MDMA.

CHARGES:

Based on my investigation and the above listed information, I request the District Attorney review this case and issue the above listed charges.
