Message From The DA

Our nation has experienced two acts of terror this past month that claimed so many innocent lives and our hearts go out to the victims and their families. During the pandemic, we have seen a rise in hate crimes and hate incidents against our Asian communities. This is something we will not tolerate. If you see or hear something that looks like a hate incident or a hate crime, please report it immediately. While we are focused on the alarming increase in hate targeting our Asian communities, we remain focused on stopping all hate against any race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, gender or disability which are the five protected categories under the law. My call to action is for you to report all hate crimes by calling 911 if it's an emergency, and in non-emergency circumstances calling your police department, FBI or directly contacting our office where we created an easy access point to report online at SanDiego-DA.com, or email at hatecrimes@sdccda.org, or call at (619) 515-8805. We want to make sure everyone is safe in our community.


