Resource Fair



Our January resource fair was a great success! We hosted 17 organizations who assisted community members with a wide range of services such as: Food Bank, Housing Assistance, Medical and Cal-Fresh Enrollment, Employment Services, Mental Health Services, and Educational Services. We had over 160 community member attend the event.

After reviewing survey results from the resource fair, 96% of community members who attended the event found our services to be extremely helpful. 100% of community members who attended, found the food distribution to meet their expectations. Additionally, the most common phrase used to describe the event was "very good food and service".

The next resource fair is scheduled to take place Saturday, January 19, 2019 at the CARE Community Center (12 N. Euclid Ave, National City, CA, 91950).

CARE Center Success Stories

- Seven males who initially enrolled at the VOA received Housing Assessments from CARE. Following program completion, all seven received permanent housing.
- Through a community partnership, we were able to secure full family membership to the Jackie Robinson YMCA for a CYC participant and his family.
- Through CYC, a participant was referred to Playwrights Project. Additionally, the referral helped provide the entire family with mediation sessions to resolve their problems.

Victim Resource Initiative



The Victim Resource Navigation Program has expanded its reach to Father Joe's Families and Single Women Shelter as well as the Neil Good Day Center in downtown San Diego. The Victim Resource Navigation Program is an initiative started at the District Attorney's Office to help individuals who are homeless and have been a victim of a crime in the last 12 months access services.

Project R.O.O.T.S.



Project ROOTS, formerly known as Girls Only! and Boys Only!, was founded on the need to address the root causes of gender-based violence including commercial sexual exploitation and sex trafficking, rape, domestic violence, and sexual assault in the local context of San Diego.

As a partnership between Project Concern International (PCI) and the San Diego County District Attorney's Office, this toolkit serves as a guide for implementing a gender-specific, culturally responsive, and developmentally appropriate prevention education program for boys and girls ages 8 to 13.

The mission is to provide a quality group mentoring program that influences positive youth development by allowing students to learn, explore, achieve and discover through social and emotional learning, and academic enrichment activities.

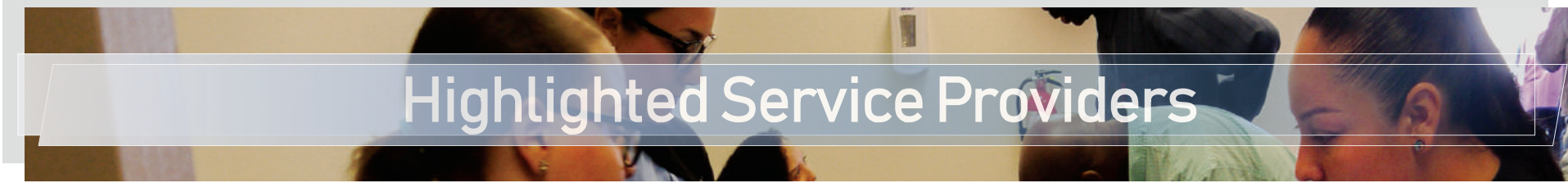
As of today, Project ROOTS can be found in 17 different after-school sites across San Diego county.
