

VICTIM RESOURCE INITIATIVE

The Alpha Project Tent located on 16th Street and Newton Avenue in Downtown San Diego houses hundreds of men and women who are taking steps to get permanent housing. Danielle, the Victim Resource Navigator isproviding the residents of the tent who have been a victim of crime within the last 12 months, access to supportive services as well as guidance and support through legal process. Examples of crimes are domestic violence, assult, identity theft, human trafficking, elderly abuse, etc. Danielle is administering an evidence-based assessment to assist qualifying idividuals with services such as violence counseling, clothing, mentalhealth services and transportation assistance to appointments. The Victim Resource Navigator is on site at the tent several days a week.
